Studies show our learning experience is deeper and longer lasting when we are engaged fully in the topic we are studying. Has our learning become like most everything else in our culture - fast, quick, and easy? Many discussions are taking place regarding the pros and cons of on-line vs. classroom learning. Part of me understands the advantage to online courses, and yet I have always been drawn and see more value with the traditional classroom environment; both as a student and teacher. When I speak of on-line learning, I am not referring to self-directed on line, I am referring to the quick and easy - pass the test and walk away with not much more

than a certificate of completion. Does passing a requirement fulfill professional and personal development? Hmmmm... requirement vs. development, transformation and growth; certainly something to ponder.

In the traditional classroom environment there is opportunity to create a network, build relationships with like-minded people, opportunity to ask questions, engage in group support, time for selfreflection, deepen and embody the material being offered, peer mentoring and so much more. Often when I review participant's course feedback, some of the most effective advantages of the traditional classroom stated are; the opportunity to learn from others is invaluable, the ability to share and feel heard is both healing and empowering, and the ability to digest and embody the material is long lasting - all are seeds of personal and professional growth and transformation!
